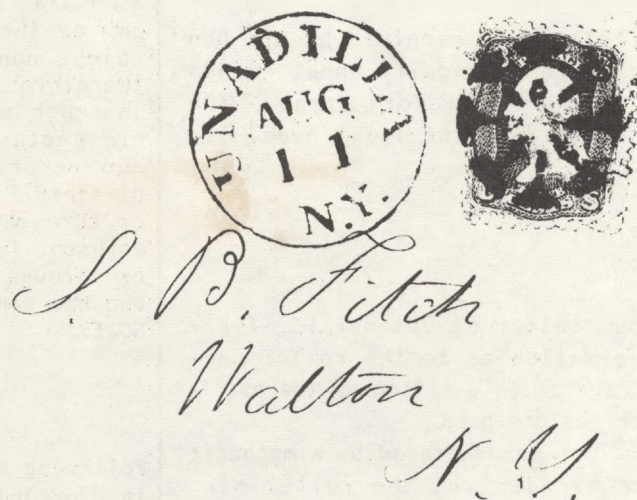

UNADILLA, N. Y. COVER

On the front page illustration #1 is shown a cover from Unadilla, N.Y. This cover was submitted to Mr. W. W. Reynolds shortly before his series in STAMPS was discontinued but was never illustrated in that series. We believe this is the first time this cancel has been seen in print.

AN UNUSUAL CANCEL FROM FORT WAYNE, IND.

The following letter was received by Mr. Don Halferty in reply to an inquiry about an odd cancel he had noticed from Fort Wayne. The cancel is illustrated on the front page, illustration #2.

"Mr. Don Halferty  
Albion, Indiana  
Dear Sir:

I have your letter of October 16, 1952, requesting information as to the roller cancelling device used at this office on the specimen cancellation you enclosed.

This device was manufactured by a mechanic of this office by adapting the roller of a standard hand roller to receive the dies normally used in a mechanical cancelling machine.

It is used only on bulky first class matter which cannot be run through a cancelling machine, and which were previously postmarked with a hand stamp.

It was placed in use on September 8, 1952 upon receipt of authority to do so by the Assistant Postmaster General, Bureau of Post Office Operations, Division of Clerical Service, in letter of August 25, 1952.

He is doing a wonderful job and has already prepared about 8000 drawings covering about every known cancellation. He has painstakingly checked and rechecked the place of origin of such cancellations previously stated in the lists of Richtie, Dr. Evans and Reynolds against the large and comprehensive collections of Burleigh Jacobs, Walter Plant, Dr. W. R. McAdams, Gilbert Burr, E. L. Willard, C. M. Phillips and

Please send in whatever you can particularly information not hitherto printed. Accurate drawings add a great deal to the interest. Please make them black and on light colored paper since they reproduce much better for us. Also please make drawings the exact size whenever possible. If that is not possible please note exact size of original in mm.

We note that the "Pikes Peak Gold Rush" Cover collection belonging to H. Parker Johnson has won two grand awards recently, one at the Oklahoma Federation Show at Bartlesville, Okla. and the other at the "Atomex" show at Grand Junction, Colo.

We note that our First Vice-President, Burleigh E. Jacobs, has been nominated by the Washington, D.C. Philatelic Society as a candidate for the presidency of the American Philatelic Society in the election for a two-year term to be held this year. More about this in our next issue.

On pages 65, 66 & 67 we reproduce drawings sent us by Mr. Edward L. Willard. These Cancellations all are on Scott #210, the 2¢ Brown and it is our understanding that the origin of many of them is unknown to Mr. Willard. We would be glad to get definite information on such cancels. His address is 6 Leitzell Bldg., State College, Pa.

## SALES DEPARTMENT NOTES

As this is written it would be impossible for us to make up a circuit for any one of our circuit groups. Twenty-five circuits are now out. We need fine material both on and off cover immediately, from both the 19th and the 20th Centuries. Even some of the commoner items will sell if properly priced but please don't price common material too high because that will eliminate any possibility of sales. Our members are mostly well versed in values and object to paying transportation on material which is too common and priced too high. There is one fact we must remember, however, which is that Cancellations on US stamps and US Covers are selling at auction for continually higher prices and that the market on them shows a firmness not exhibited by any other philatelic properties. Please send us the Covers and Cancels which you do not need for your own collections. Put a price on them which you would be willing to pay if you needed the item and we are sure you will be pleased with the results.

Please do not write in Sales Books except to sign for stamps taken. If you have comments to make as to price, condition or authenticity of items please make them on a separate piece of paper and sign your name. Either enclose the paper in the Sales Book or send it to the Sales Manager. Since we do not have a Board of Examiners we welcome such comments if made in the proper manner. I am sure we have no members who will knowingly submit stamps with counterfeit cancels or other doubtful items but some will get in. Our Sales Manager does not consider himself competent to act as even an unofficial Board of Examiners and up to now our Board of Governors has not considered the question important enough to warrant the extra trouble and expense of an official Board of Examiners. Most of our members are quite expert and well able to protect themselves from any items of a doubtful nature.
