ANNUAL CONVENTION & EXHIBIT

The Long Beach (Calif) Stamp Collectors Club has extended an invitation to USCC to hold our Annual Convention and Exhibition in conjunction with their Exhibit on June 18 - 20th in Long Beach, Calif. This is one of the major national exhibits to be held this year and USCC has been pleased to accept.

A meeting for USCC members is being arranged and a special section in the exhibition is to be set aside for U S Cancellations under our cosponsorship. This section is to be subdivided as follows:

- a) Any one issue 19th Century
- b) Any specialized subject or type of cancellation - 19th century
- c) 19th century cancellations in general
- d) 20th century cancellations in general

There will be nice trophies and awards offered which should encourage our membership to participate. USCC is providing an unusual specially designed plate award and the Long Beach Collectors Club is providing ist, 2nd and 3rd place trophy awards. In addition USCC award certificates will be given. Other general information is as follows:

- All entries will be subject to the general rules set forth in the prospectus of the Long Beach Stamp Collectors Club.
- 2) Frames will accommodate 4 pages.
- 3) Frame fee is \$1.00 per frame
- 4) Judging will be done by their appointed board with suggested point basis 30% presentation; 30% Research; 20% Condition; 20% Rariety.

Mrs. Emily Moorefield, 68 Bennett Ave., Long Beach 3, Calif. is in charge of the arrangements for USCC. She is a member of USCC and an officer of the Long Beach Stamp Collectors Club. Our membership is urged to participate in this years exhibit, our first on the West Coast and prospectus may be obtained thru Mrs. Moorefield and she will likewise handle frame reservations.

HELP WANTED: WHITFIELD

On the front page are ten illustrations. Each one shows a part of a cancellation which Mr. Whitfield wishes to complete. Perhaps some members can help him.

He writes as follows:

#1: Both Postmarks in blue on 3ϕ 1851 stamps. There are no towns listed with the letters in the first postmark. Would like to know what the center markings mean. There is a similarity between them which makes it appear the first is a counterfeit. However, the ink is of identical shade. Would like to know if there are any other postmarks like the first one.

#2: oon the 3¢ 1870. Unfortunately I lost this cancel which was on a piece of cover. The postmark may not be the same station(B) but the rest of it is correct. I have been told the cancel reads "City Delivery, New York". I have seen four copies of this cancel but all were indistinct. Would like to know if anyone has a good, clean strike of this cancellation.

#3: On the 3ϕ [86]. This cancellation has baffled me as to what it is. I have seen it listed before but not distinct. Would like to see a clear strike of this one.

#4: On the 3ϕ [86]. This strike looks like a clover leaf. However, the lower part may not be complete. Would like to know definitely whether it is a clover leaf or a cross grid cancellation. #5: I cannot make out the rest of this postmark which is on a cover addressed to Lieut. To Ao Capron, U.S.A.,/Fort Heartsuff/Nebraska (1879) with a 1ϕ & a 2ϕ stamp. Would like to know what state used this postmark and what is the meaning of "Carrier Station". This is the only postmark i have seen of this type.

#6: This one in red on a 3¢ 1851 stamp

#7: On 3¢ Green. Letters RO?

#8: On 3¢ 1861. Letters?

#9: On 3¢ Green. Head?

#10: On 2ϕ Brown 1883. I have seen this one with lettering on the inside. Would like to know what the wording is.

Editor's note: It is our understanding that Mr. Whitfield is working on the final details of getting his book published. He plans to have 244 pages and to sell the book for \$5.00. Also he plans to continue making drawings of Cancels which are not included and to issue supplements from time to time.





That some of our members have definite information of particular value to others is illustrated again by an experience reported by Maj. Gen. C. H. Bonesteel. Under date of Jan. 31, 1954 he writes: "On page 4 of QUARTERLY NO. 2, Figures 1, 2, 3, 4 and on page 24 of QUARTERLY No. 3, Figures 5 & 6 some cancellations I had sent you were illustrated. I had no idea where they came from and asked for help. Just a week ago I was shown two covers from St. Louis, Mo. with similar Cancellations used in 1879. One of them was

of which Fig. 6 was undoubtedly a part. Mr. Plant of Washington, a member of USCC, was my informant.

A recent change in the Post Office Department ruling on insured parcels post eliminates the numbers on packages insured for \$10.00 at a fee of 10ϕ . Since the shipment appears safer if a number is assigned and signatures are required, we suggest that, from now on, members insure the packages for \$25.00, fee for which is 15ϕ .

INFORMATION ON 20th CENTURY CANCELS

The following comes from Mr. Moe Luff, 1557 Hoe Ave., New York 60, N.Y.:

NEW YORK CITY POSTAL ZONE NUMBERS

In the early part of 1952 the New York, N.Y. Post Office Dept. inaugurated the use of Postal Zone Numbers in the Dater Circle (Townmark) of the cancelling machines in conjunction with Slogan Cancels, Station Name Cancels and 7 Wavy Line Cancels. At present practically all the New York City stations are using the Zone Number Dater Circles and have been seen.

POSTAL SLOGAN CANCELS BREAK RECORDS IN 1953

Except for 1898 and 1910 U. S. POSTAL SLOGAN CANCELS have been in use in one or more cities every year since 1897. During 1953, 128 different slogans were in use in various cities which was 17 more than were used in 1923, the next highest year. 1952 was third with 110 different and 1922 was fourth with 105. Groups wishing to sponsor SLOGAN CANCELS should write the Assistant Postmaster General, Bureau of Finance, Washington, D.C. for information and instructions.
