

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#### SPA CONVENTION

The Kent Philatelic Society of Grand Rapids, Mich., host to the 1956 SPA Convention the last week in August, made it possible for us to cooperate in the Exhibition by awarding three USCC Certificates for the best showings of Cancellation or Postal History Exhibits. Also we were invited to share a booth with the Peninsular State Philatelic Society so that the name of the Club was seen by all. We hope to give you a report of the results in our November issue. Your Secretary took the liberty of asking Mr. E. E. Puls of Birmingham to take charge of making these arrangements and wishes to thank him for his co-operation.

The following press release has been received:

Two U.S. CANCELLATION CLUB members decided to swap stocks intact, and so there came about one of the largest transactions of its kind ever to be consummated in Chicago.

Alex F. Ullrich of Glenview, Ill. disposed of his entire stock of over 10,000 early U.S.A. Covers with fancy cancellations and illustrated Corner Cards in exchange for Mr. Otokar Cerny's \$40 000° holding of U.S.A. Revenues. Also included in the transaction was a partial cash consideration of the estimated cash value of the holdings. Mr. Carny acted in behalf of a syndicate of Chicago Dealers including John Fred Vickery and Geo. Byrd.

Mre Ullrich is most desirous of rebuilding his stock of illustrated advertising covers before the 70th anniversary exhibition and show of the Chicago Philatelic Society in November. Mr. Ullrich's booth at the CPS and ASDA shows in Chicago has been quite a mecca for both dealers and collectors of early U.S.A. Covers and is remembered by the now famous booth slogan, "Largest Holding of U.S. Covers outside of New York City. Minimum purchase at this booth \$100\_00". ### SALES DEPARTMENT NOTES

We wish to remind you of the new scale of charges for the Sales  $\mbox{Department}_{\mbox{\tiny S}}$  This new scale was announced and explained in the October OUAR-TERLY to apply on all material received on or after Nov. 1, 1955. Books received after that time are beginning to come up for retirement so we take this opportunity to set forth the new scale again. The flat charge of 25¢ per book is discontinued. The Sales Manager's Commission is increased from 10% of gross sales to 15% with a minimum charge on each book of cover enclosure of 25% Instead of charging 1% perannum of original value for insurance we now charge  $1\frac{1}{2}$ % of original value with a minimum charge of 25¢ on each book or cover enclosure. These two charges along with cost of returning are deducted at time of retirement

We are in our second year with our new ins. policy which gives full coverage on circuits in transit between members without postal insurance or registration. Results have been satisfactory.

We still have in the stock of the Sales Department an excellent selection of the fancy Cancels of the late 1920s. Any interested member who has not seen them should ask the Sales Manager for them. Also we have good selections of all other 20th Century material both covers & stamps. Those interested and who have not had the regular circuits should ask for them.

As usual we need fine material in all categories. Desirable items reasonably priced sell

readily. Also as usual we wish to urge members to be extra careful not to make errors in their reports and to forward circuits promptly. Holding circuits unreasonably long disrupts the whole schedule not only of that circuit, but of all others in that group,



# New York Foreign Mail Cancellations 1870-1876




UP to the late seventies almost anything was used for cancelling U. S. stamps, however poorly many of these served that purpose. In size, composition, and shape cancellors ranged from a thumb to what have you.

Neat and attractive, well made handstamps were exceptional. From the late 70's, however, standardized types came into use by order of Washington; these gradually replaced the "individualized" shapes. With exceptions, largely without official sanction, standardized cancellors have been in continuous use ever since.

It was fitting, therefore, that this unique group of New York Foreign Mails should have been the last really attractive fancy cancellations to be used on U. S. stamps. A number of these stars and geometrics were illustrated some years ago in a French philatelic publication with data by this writer in parallel columns of French and English. Looking through them at the time, a prominent French philatelist and collector of postal markings remarked, "As stamp obliterations these are the perfection of form." Whether that was an apt description or not, these cancellations have stirred steadily increasing interest in recent years.

Collectors specializing in one or more sections of 19th Century U. S. or other postal markings are avid but not very numerous. Their number in the U. S. is still proportionately low compared to that of other countries. But show any one of them a cancellation he wants--particularly if hit full on the face--then watch his face!

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
