HARTSHORNE

Mr. J. L. Hargett (#508) discovered these three covers in an accumulation of covers and cards which he recently acquired. Neither he nor Gaspare Signorelli (#368) had seen this cancellation before. These may be the only copies in existence showing this fanciest of fancy killers from Indian Territory.

Hartshorne, which still exists, is located in the heart of the coal mining region of the Coctaw Nation. A Postoffice was established there on March 5,1890 with Henry Martyn as Postmaster. The C, O & G RR was later absorbed in

the Rock Island system.

This Cancellation which is struck twice on each of the covers, has so much detail it is difficult to reproduce accurately. It was used at least $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, January, 1896 to June 1899. It appears to be a reproduction of three or more Indian symbols including at least two dolls.

The dept. has put a stop to forwarding any such pieces even in the same city or town. Please be sure we get your changes of address promptly since each copy of the NEWS sent to an address no longer the correct one will be returned to us with the new address noted and with postage due 8¢. Postage due on packages returned in the same way will be the same as the postage originally paid with the minimum 8¢.

Dr. Robert Landis (#449) is Chairman of the Committee on Registration for the Oregon Stamp Societies! Exhibition August 30 to Sept. 2.


Allan D, Parsons (#122) would like to see Postal Guides from 1880 also January & July, 1881. The Club's Library would welcome donations of Postal Guides.




