AMONG OUT MEMBERS

Edwin E. Puls (#60) has been named General Chairman of the 25th annual convention and exhibition of the Peninsular State Philatelic Society to be held March 30-31 in the Community House at Birmingham, Mich.

Miss Barbara R. Mueller (#360) continues to write authoritatively on a number of subjects for a number of Philatelic Publications, especially WESTERN STAMP COLLECTOR and The BUREAU SPECIALIST.

FRONT PAGE

On the front page we illustrate three covers, the first one is one of the finest examples of the "Devil & Pitchfork" we have seen. It belongs to Mr. Earle E. Andrus (#496). The other two belong to Mr. Edward L. Willard (#125) one from Waseca, Minn. and the other from Jericho, Vt. They show that the W in target cancel illustrated first in the January, 1959 issue and again on page 46 of the November 1962 issue was used at both places. We only hope the illustrations do justice to the three covers.

USCC CERTIFICATE

Regarding the controversy on USCC Certificate mentioned on page 57 of the January NEWS we have had expressions of opinion from a few members. We certainly wish to handle this according to the wishes of the members and need opinions from more to really get the consensus.

The Negative M cancel on page 57 of the January NEWS is from Mystic, Conn., this information from Mr. E. W. Eddy (#32)

Further information reg. the Columbus GRID discussed on page 57 of the January NEWS comes from Mr. Birney Mills (#142). He reports having three covers franked with the 3¢ 1857 stamps postmarked Jan. 7, March 1st, and April 24th. The March 1st one is dated Feb. 28th in the same hand which addressed the envelope. Since these stamps were demonitized later it appears that these covers were all used in 1861, earlier than stated in the article published.

At the Exhibit of the Kent Philatelic Society in November Earle E. Andrus (#496) was awarded a "First" in the U. S. Section and also a "Best in Show" Cup for his eight frames of USA. Included in his exhibit was the West Meriden, Conn. "Devil & Pitchfork" shown on the front page. Dr. William E. Wilson (#24) received the SPA Research Award for his exhibit of USA. Mr. Andrus' Winning entry was exhibited again on December 1 at the dedication of the new Post Office building in Grand Rapids.

A recent issue of LINN'S contained an article by Bob Pritchard (#454) about the enjoyment he has derived from forming his topical collection and exhibit, "Baseball on Stamps", particularly interesting to your editor since he played a small amount of baseball some fifty and more years ago.

If you write the Chairman of our Research Committee and do not get an immediate reply please be patient until after the 10th of April. He has escaped the rigors of late winter in northern Illinois.

Dr. Robert S. de Wasserman (#418) has sent us a photograph of a cover he recently purchased in Belgium. The stamp, a 5¢ 1847, is tied to cover by a black 5 ring target. The Cincinnati Postmark is in red and has "5 cts" at the bottom. Cover is addressed to Lexington, Ky. Dr. deWasserman requests that other members who know of covers with target cancels on this stamp get in touch with him. Brookman states that such are very rare and known to him only from Greenwich, N.Y. and Hanover, N.H.

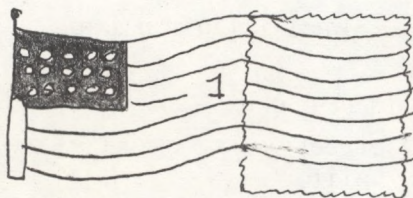
HERST-ZARESKI
