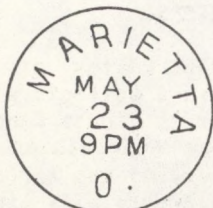

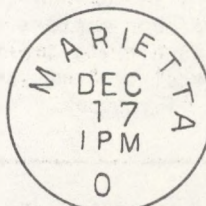
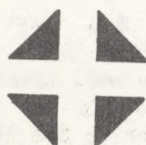

The USCC Certificate was awarded to Mr. W. C. Aichele, Hollister, Calif. for his exhibit of 19th Century Colorado Town Cancellations. Walton E. Tinsley (#376) received a Gold Medal for his exhibit of 2¢ Vermilions, also a trophy for the best 19th Century exhibit of USA.

Melvin W. Jackson (#468) received an award for his "Early U.S. Precancels", also for his "China First Day Covers".

OMAHA

At the Omaha Philatelic Society show held in April the USCC Certificate went to J. Stanley Thompson (#439) for "Fancy Cancels on the U.S. 3¢ 1869". The Grand Award and TMPs President's Trophy was won by James H. Wilson (#500) for "Cancellations & Postmarks 1883-87 on #210, 2¢ Brown". Second place and Council Bluffs Award went to Arthur J. Rogers (#438) for "Omaha Advertising Covers".

PENINSULAR STATE

At the 25th annual convention of the Peninsular State Philatelic Society held recently at Birmingham, Mich. The Grand Award and also the SPA Research Award was won by Arthur Van Vlissingen (#49) with his exhibit of New York Foreign Mail Cancellations. 1871-1900 Machine Cancellations shown by Edwin E. Puls (#60) also took an award. Mr. Puls is assistant editor of the Club's Publication, The Peninsular Philatelist.

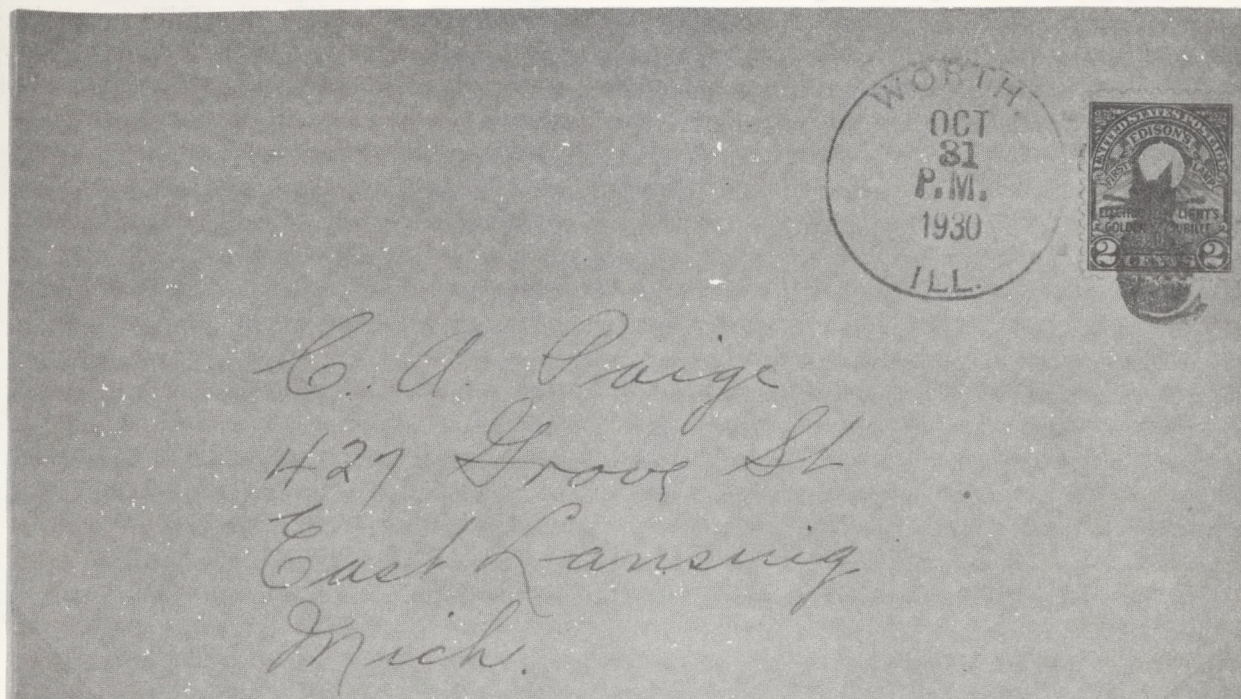

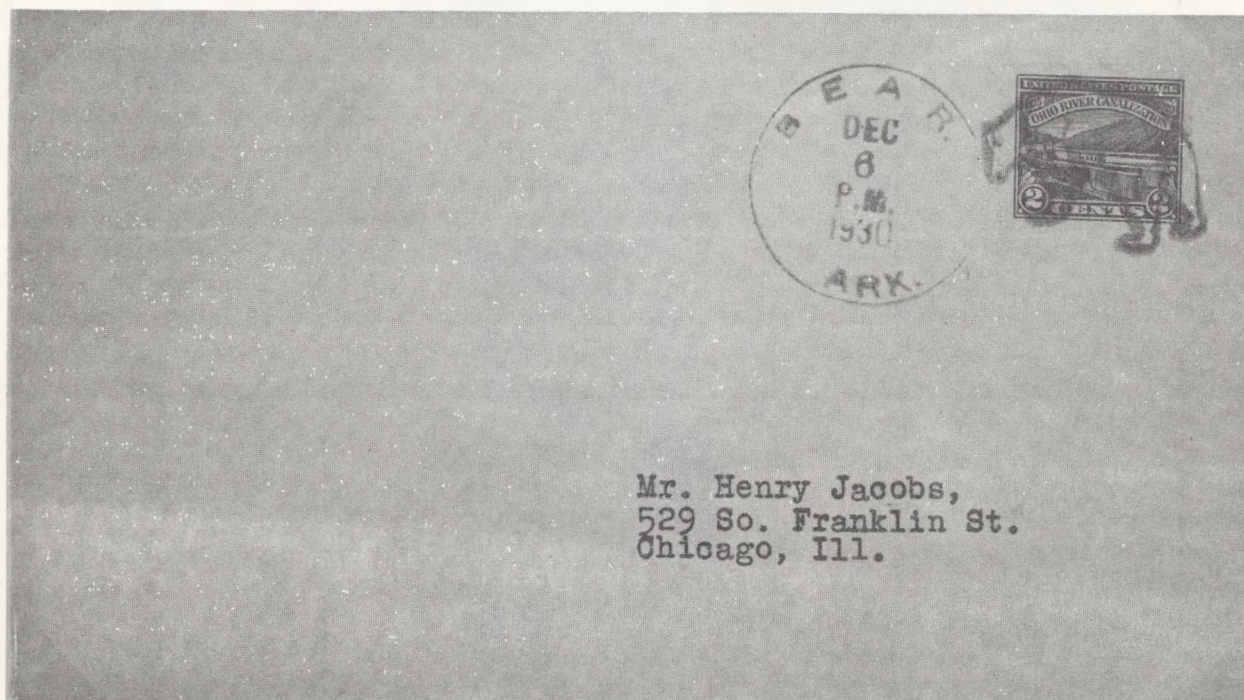
