

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTION

OUTGOING UNIT

After correspondence with the Postmaster at Akron, Ohio and with Birney Mills (#142) Arthur VanVlissingen(#49) has determined that the cover illustrated on Page 62 of the March NEWS. It appears that in main Post Offices having more than one Zip Code # and therefore do not include the Zip Code # in the postmark, words have been substituted and this mark simply shows that the item was postmarked in the "outgoing Unit".

AMONG OUR MEMBERS

Dr. W. A. Jurgens(#494) is State Editor for one of the sections of the OFFICIAL PRECANCEL CATALOG, and has just finished editing the catalog for the Precancels of Alaska, Canal Zone, Caroline Islands, District of Columbis, Guam, Hawaii, Phoenix Group, Puerto Rico, Samoa, Virgin Islands, and United Nations. It is a catalog of 36 pages, pricing all known denominations of all styles of the above States and Territories individually. The high prices attaching to many items will be a great surprise to those who regard precancels as throw-aways. In fact, there are three different types of Washington, D. C., known on about 30 to 35 different denominations, and listing at a minimum of \$10 each, and up to \$25. The interesting thing about these three types is that they do not look much like the usual precancel, and could easily be mistaken for parcel post killers, when in fact they are very desirable and much sought after precancels. 

ANOTHER PAGE OF ABBREVIATED POSTMARKS FROM THE COLLECTION OF ARTHUR H. BOND (#505)



HEALDSBURG, CALIFORNIA (Parcel Post) It has not been my good fortune to acquire this cancellation in its entirety. In the illustration, left and right halves have been fitted together for 95% completeness. Struck in black ink, it is a delicate oval with serifed letters and bears little resemblance to the more common "bumper" handstamp.

In 1958, being curious about it, I wrote to the postmaster in Healdsburg, Mr. John Cross. He was most helpful and inquired among the older employees at the office none of whom were able to recall it. Later it developed that he was able to talk to one of the retired clerks who remembered that it was ordered during the First World War and had been used from about 1918 to "possibly as late as 1930." The reason for its rather long life "was that they usually ordered at least two of a kind of each stamp and no doubt one of them could last, with use of the proper ink, for five or six years as at that time the parcel post in this office was not very heavy and it would not have had much use." It was also usual for one person to cancel parcel post and the employee, a lady now deceased, was the customary user and "probably cancelled the parcel post at the end of the day after closing her money-order window."


It is seldom that one is able to get such complete information and I am grateful indeed to Mr. Cross for his kindness. Please note that the use of this handstamp in its latest period was only 37 years ago, yet it was nearly forgotten!

It is hoped that all who have facts, even scant, about any unusual cencellations will report them for the reference records which all 20th century collectors will wish to keep.
