Combination Cover. Scott Nos. 87, 88 and 89, the 2¢ Blackjack, 3¢ Rose and 10¢ Green, all with E Grill, make up the 15¢ rate on this cover from Buffalo, N. Y. to Paris. In addition to the Buffalo postmark and the Circle of "V" killer in black, there is a New York transit in black, with the date June 25, and a Calais transit marking in blue, July 8. The straightline mark in black INSUFFICIENTLY PAID is supported by a black crayon 16, indicating 16 Centimes due. The letter was overweight. The original contents are present, and in addition to the long family epistle, there is a clipping from a Buffalo newspaper describing a wedding in Cleveland. A docketing establishes the year as 1868.

SPECIAL SERVICES BY THE NEW YORK POST OFFICE

Z MAR T PASSENGER B B4 LIVER

In the April 26, 1969 issue of STAMPS, Mr. Edward L. Willard (#125) had a short article discussing another special service rendered by the New York Postoffice to passengers on outgoing steamers. The cover illustrated is franked by a single 2¢ Brown and is postmarked Mar. 8 84. Also on the cover is the stamp shown above. It is addressed to Mr. John B. Hostlet. "Passenger by the Cunard S.S. Servia". New York City.

Definitely this is not a Supplementary Mail Marking but that of another unusual service by the New York Postoffice.

Mr. E. D. Piper, Librarian of the Garfield-Perry Stamp Club who has been indexing Philatelic Periodicals for the Club's Philatelic Reference Collection for some 20 years acds to this by stating that STAMPS for July 12, 1952 published an article by the late Harry Konwiser discussing the use of a similar hand stamp in 1883 which cancelled a Canadian stamp on a cover addressed to a "Passenger by the City of Rome", New York.

Covers with this marking appear to be very rare. Any of you who know of such covers would be doing us all a favor by notifying Mr. Willard or your Editor.

SLOGAN CANCEL ERROR

Lawton, Oklahoma is using a slogan cancel this year. "Fort Sill Centennial 100 Years of service 1869 - 1969"


Capt. F. H. HemphillJr. (#733) suddenly noticed that on a letter received from Mrs. Hemphill the name was spelled "STILL". He has several copies of this error on cover all from his wife and all addressed to him at his APO #. These were mailed late in March or early in April. The specimen he sent us was postmarked March 29. We hoped to show this cover, but the error occurs on the black 4¢ stamp and does not photograph too well although it certainly is discernable on the cover. The error was discovered by the Postal Dept. and corrected after being in use only a short time. But any of you who have correspondents in Lawton. Okla, might well inspect any of those covers you still have. This may well be a rarity.


