

On page 34 we show three cancellations sent in by Mr. Lawrence L. Williams (#377). The Morton Salt Girl" is blue on the 2¢ green Bank Note. It is a beautiful killer and must have been striking on a stamp of another color. The other two cancels shown are in black on 3¢ Green stamps and Mr. Williams is asking if anyone can tell him where they were used. Write him or the editor.

C. Russell Moir (#109) whose death is noted in this issue had a large accumulation of what his widow calls "cancellations". I suspect that they are mostly 20th Century Covers of different types since he has been on our circuit group for such material for many years. Mrs. Moir wonders what she can do with them. Mr. Weiss also received the CLARENCE BRAZER MEMORIAL TROPHY as well as a Silver Medal at SOJEX for his exhibit, "Essays & Proofs of the U.S. Issues of 1861-1867".

Gayle A. Foster (#958) exhibited 7 frames of "Characteristic and Fancy Cancellations on U.S. Postal Cards" at BECKPEX. (Fullerton, Cai.) and received 5 awards, including the Grand Award and "Best in Show".

William K. Herzog (#879) exhibited his "US 1861 thru 1868" at COMPEX (Classics section) and at NOPEX and received a Gold Medal at COMPEX and a Silver at NOPEX. At the Annual show of the Saginaw Valley Stamp Society he showed "Civil War Covers, USA-CSA" for the Grand Award.




