More On The COLUMBIA/IELFIELD

John W. Koontz, Co-Editor of Machine Cancel Forum, has sent us the following information on Columbia, Columbia/Ielfield, and Ielfield cancels, excerpted from the August 1942 issue of "XX-Killers":

The Ielfield machine, though always associated with Columbia machines (Silver Creek, New product separate York) was a made -- according to available name plates -in Forestville, New York. Because of the similarity of the machines, identification has often and difficult, confusing, impossible.

Chronology:

1898 - origins of Columbia

1900 - Columbia Postal Supply Company, incorporated at Silver Creek, New York, owned by Ielfield family.

Dies for both companies were cut during this time by an independent contractor in the Greater New York area, who made no uniform distinction in style between the two. However he did sporadically use several types of wave killers, probably the effect of different workmen doing the cutting. While Ielfield was independent he took in for repair or remachines, building Columbia Digitized by https://stangerapher.ord/y went out under his name plate.
